Adult male and female sex offenders

We provide a variety of services including:

Our areas of specialism include:

Specialist assessments and intervention plans for offenders with complex issues, including:- learning difficulties, post traumatic stress disorder, problems with sexual fantasy management, struggling to engage in supervision.

- Intervention for offenders on short licences before their supervision expiry dates.
- A psychometric service to help formulate intervention and risk management plans.
- Advice, assessment, intervention and joint working in custody and the community, including individually tailored supervision packages as part of a community order or licence in collaboration with Prisons, Probation and Approved Premises.

Young adults

We work with offender managers to devise and deliver supervision plans and intervention programmes for young adults aged 18 to 21 and where appropriate include engagement with their families.

Assessment and intervention programmes are individually tailored, developmentally sensitive, and address risks and needs. These programmes can be provided as alternatives to custody or post release for both male and female young adults.

Assessment and intervention with young people in custody who are unable to access accredited SOTP in Young Offender Institutions or the delivery of on-going work identified post SOTP.

LFF staff are experienced in providing **support to offender managers** for young adults in the transition between custody and the community and between the young people's secure estate and the young adult estate.

On-going intervention and assistance with risk management of young adults (18+) who have undertaken Lucy Faithfull Foundation's Youth Justice Board funded YOI based programmes for 15 to 18 year olds.

Monitoring offenders computers

LFF can monitor the home computer use of your offenders on your behalf using Securus software and let you know when a 'concern' arises. The software is installed onto the offenders computer and monitors content - rather than blocking or filtering. The software scans everything on-screen 24 hours a day, and includes all technology including websites, documents, images and messaging technology and captures a screen shot of anything concerning.

LFF trained staff review all captures, alerting the offender manager if further action is required.
